According to the total number of inhabitants in each country. This can only serve as orientation. Finally, the quality of the projects is the most important criteria.



Guidelines: subjects and “new” teachers

Every NSC should pay attention that the national delegation represents biology, chemistry and physics as well as primary school teachers in a balanced way.

Focus on teachers! Only teachers, teachers working as teacher trainers or students who would like to become teachers are allowed to participate.

At least half of the delegation has to consist of “new” teachers who have not visited any Science on Stage festival before.

Suggestion allocation of subjects:

I) Countries with 12 delegates:

→ at least three persons out of each subject and two primary school teachers.

II) Countries with 9 delegates:

→ at least two persons out of each subject and one primary school teacher.

III) Countries with 5 delegates:

→ at least one person out of each subject and if possible, one primary school teacher.

IV) UK:

→ 30% out of each subject, 10% primary school teachers each country.
